The 11th World Congress on Neurohypophysial Hormones (Oxytocin and Vasopressin) will be held in Queenstown, New Zealand from August 29 - September 1, 2015, against the spectacular backdrop of the Southern Alps. Oxytocin and vasopressin impact the brain and peripheral systems, mediating social behavioural and physiological responses to changes in the internal and external environment.
