In the email, include the authors on the poster, the poster title, and a brief description of the significance of the work to behavioral neuroendocrinology. Be precise about your direct contribution to the work and be sure to explain why your work is important and interesting (50 word maximum). **The application deadline is May 25.**

Note: Individuals who have won a poster award in the last two years are not eligible to compete for the same type of award.

POSITION POSTING**POSTDOCTORAL POSITION IN BEHAVIORAL NEUROSCIENCE**

An NIH funded postdoctoral position is available in [the laboratory of Alexa Veenema](#) in the Department of Psychology at Boston College to study the neural circuits underlying social play behavior in rats and how these circuits differ in males and females, with a focus on sex-specific effects mediated by the neuropeptide vasopressin. Our laboratory utilizes molecular, biochemical, anatomical and behavioral approaches to elucidate the roles of vasopressin and oxytocin within neural circuits modulating social behavior. Applicants must have a PhD and interest and experience in behavioral neuroscience techniques. The position is available starting in September 2015 and applications will be considered until the position is filled. Salary is commensurate with experience, according to NIH guidelines.
